

This is a brief summary of the key points from the meeting of **Shotley Parish Council**, held on **16 July 2009**. More details will be in the minutes next month.

The Community Warden reported that yet again more glass is being smashed on the tennis courts and spoiling the play area for genuine users and that irresponsible dog owners were allowing their pets to foul the pavements at a time when many more people are out and about.

Planning applications had been approved by Babergh for:

- **River View, Estuary Road** – Erection of first floor balcony;
- **76 Great Harlings** - Erection of a rear conservatory;
- **The Corn Barn, Shotley Hall Barns** - replacement of rear ground floor window with door; and
- **Altona, Estuary Crescent** - Erection of a single-storey rear extension, single storey front extension to existing garage and conversion of part existing garage to form additional living accommodation

Six crimes were recorded for the month of June – two of criminal damage; three of theft and one of theft with common assault and battery

HMS Ganges - 404 retirement community development – There was a possibility that the Planning Officer would be putting the Reserved Matters before the Babergh Development Committee on 26 August. However the Council felt this was premature as it had not had sufficient time to respond regarding the appropriate assessment as this had not yet been received for comment – this to be taken up with Babergh. **A Scoping Document** was considered with regard to a mixed use development – “**The Paragraph 29 Application**” – The Council agreed a response. Despite requesting an update of both Babergh and the developers no further news had been received on the **HMS Ganges Mast** situation.

It was reported that **cyclists** had been seen to be riding dangerously on the grass wedge near the **Corner Garage**. The Safer Neighbourhood Team would be informed.

Flytipping had occurred near the school premises – if this occurs again Babergh’s Waste Management Team would be contacted so that they can investigate the waste and identify the culprits.
